

# Château Lynch-Moussas



Grand Cru Classé AOC Pauillac

A 5th Cru of the classification of 1855.

The Irishman John Lynch acquired the estate together with the vineyards of what is today the neighbouring Château Lynch-Bages and had the chateau built in the 18<sup>th</sup> century.

The Castéja family, proprietor in Pauillac since the 16th century, acquired Château Lynch-Moussas in the beginning of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. From the 1970ies onwards until today, major investments have been made at the Chateau and in the vineyard, significantly improving quality. Chateau Lynch-Moussas is the only Castéja-Chateau on the left bank not exclusively distributed through Borie-Manoux but through the “place de Bordeaux”.



Grape varieties:

25% Merlot  
75% Cabernet-Sauvignon

15-20 days
